RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF HAYWOOD COMMUNITY COLLEGE APPROVING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE CREATIVE ARTS BUILDING AND SEEKING APPROVAL FOR THE COUNTY TO BEGIN THE LOAN PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Haywood Community College acknowledges the need for a new Creative Arts facility to replace the existing Mary Cornwell Professional Crafts building; and

WHEREAS, the Creative Arts facility will house associate degree and continuing education programs in professional jewelry, wood, clay, fiber, film and video as well as photography and music, and

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that the future ability to serve the students within these programs and to expand these programs depends upon the construction of this new facility, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined through due diligence over the past several months, a reduction in cost of construction of the Creative Arts facility of over \$500,000, and

WHEREAS, the Board acknowledges due to the specialized programs that will be housed in the Creative Arts facility a higher energy load demand is placed on the facility as compared to other educational facilities, and

WHEREAS, during the planning and design stages of the project, the Board and staff implemented a design whereas the building could be used for other classrooms should the need arise, and

WHEREAS, the Board also acknowledges the cost of the Creative Arts facility to be approximately \$9,024,432 which includes the demolition of the existing building, parking and contingency costs, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Haywood Community College hereby requests the Board of Commissioners of Haywood County pass a resolution acknowledging that the Board of Trustees of Haywood Community College has approved the construction of the Creative Arts facility and that the Board of Commissioners, endorses a \$12 million loan, pending approval of the Local Government Council, to be funded through the ¼ cent sales tax proceeds, and that said loan will fund the construction of the Creative Arts facility and infrastructure needs of Haywood Community College, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED, that the Board of Trustees hereby expresses appreciation to the Board of County Commissioners for their support of Haywood Community College.
