Dear Mr. Morrow and Mrs. Lewis:


This firm represents several residents in and around Palmer Road and Francis Farm Road in the Radcliff Cove community in close proximity to the firing range that you two are proposing to locate on your property.

I am following up on communications that you have had with various people who live close to your real property. As you may know, approximately 300 people signed a petition presented to the County Commissions expressing their grave concerns over such a facility being constructed and operated in this quiet, residential neighborhood. As you know, there are hundreds of people, multiple churches, a school, and a cemetery very close to your proposed firing range. There is no doubt that your proposed use would cause a variety of harm and damage to the area and would clearly constitute a nuisance as a result of the noise, disruption, traffic, smell, pollution, etc., that your guests and you would produce, and not only would the nuisance unreasonably interfere with their enjoyment of their property, as they have enjoyed for generations in many instances, it also would negatively impact on the property values as well.

While it is not certain at this point what the County may do, it is certain that the surrounding property owners are all in agreement that your proposed use would bring great harm and disruption to the area and they intend to pursue every avenue of relief that they can in order to prevent and prohibit a firing range from being located in their front yards. If you continue to pursue that use of the property, they will seek injunctive relief and pursue you for intentionally proceeding with trying to establish a nuisance in their neighborhood.
