

3 Minute Public Comment,

February 19, 2018

I have been making Public Record Requests regarding the David Francis Dirt Spreading Project, otherwise known as the Jonathan Creek Soil Reclamation Project ever since you approved Avcon for this project.

Joel Mashburn, our Interim County Manager, is Gatekeeper for disseminating all information I have been requesting, rather than having the Custodians of those records respond. I have been met with resistance and downright obstruction in obtaining direct records.

I am asking today that the both of you intervene and instruct the actual Custodians of Public Records to respond directly to my repeated requests, some dating back to early January.

The cast of characters here involve Scott Burwell, Christy Brown and Mark Cathey from McGill Associates. McGill Associates are a vendor, and I cannot request any information from a vendor.

David Francis, Kris Boyd, Julie Davis, and Chip Killian, are all county employees, and direct Custodians of County Records. These people have never once responded directly to my series of Records Requests. These people are channeling responses through Joel Mashburn. Two employees are to be commended for responding directly, Donna Corpening and Kathi McClure, and I appreciate their responses.

I am asking publicly at this commission meeting for the following:

1. The full and complete MOU signed by Sara McCoy of Avcon on dated December 13, 2017.
2. I want the Names of the people the bids were sent to by Christy Brown of McGill in his correspondence with bidders. I want the company names, and the contact information, printed out from the County's Vendor Inquiry program.
3. I would like to inspect the actual drawings that Steve Miller (no middle initial) used to place the entrance and the 2,000 feet of Silt Fence on the worksite.

All of you commissioners are already fully aware of my repeated Requests for Public Information, as all of you are copied on the e-mails I have been sending to Joel Mashburn and the Custodians of this Public Information.
