- 7,163 more people voted for these two candidates in the run-off election than did the primary.
- **Bennett** captured around 20% of the vote, while Cawthorn captured around 18% in the primary.
- Madison Cawthorn decisively whooped Lynda Bennett in the run-off, by a factor of 2:1.
- More people who voted for different candidates in the primary, switched their vote to Cawthorn in the run-off.

And the most interesting stat:

• 4,800 people who voted for **Lynda Bennett** in the primary, changed their minds and <u>did not</u> vote for her in the run-off.
