Zito Media service, which purchased Carolina Mountain Cable Vision has not made provisions to carry the government access chanel (sic) yet, but officials promise to look into the situation. The next action step is to vote. One-stop absentee voting where individuals can both register to vote and cast a ballot opens Oct. 20. Sites are open at the Canton library, Clyde Town Hall and the Haywood County Senior Resources Center in Waynesville. Election Day is Nov. 8.
