Options are: 1) the County to create its own foundation, 2) Have a restrictive gift to a public foundation or 3) Gift to a public foundation with no restrictions. He said that #3 is out based on that. With option #1, it has a big caveat that a future Board can change it for any other purpose. It can put money where they want it. He said that the Board would have total control now but cannot bind for future Boards.

Option #2 would allow a direct plan on guidance on how the Board would want it directed or it comes back to the county. If the Board decided to go with this option, Mr. Kort will put forth the proposals and have the documents drawn up.

Mr. Killian advised that he had reviewed the matters and discussed options. He stated that with option #2, the segregated funds will be the County funds.

Mr. Dove recommended that the County goes with Option #2. He suggested that if this is chosen, the Board needs to make sure they pick a partner that has the ability to carry out what the Board wants and has the means to protect their liability. He said that he, Ms. Davis and Mr. Killian agree that this is the best option for increasing the health of Haywood county citizens for a long term.

Commissioner Sorrells asked if years from now, if the hospital is gone, can the County get the money back? Mr. Killian advised that this will need to be answered.

After discussion, it was agreed that Mr. Dove will ask Mr. Kort to drill down Option #2 and come together with information for the Board with a timetable.

Mr. Dove presented the proposed restricted fund management services agreement and summary to the Board. They reviewed it. He noted that Haywood Hospital Authority would like to release \$6 million, and there is another \$12 million in Wells Fargo to be released in a number of years. The Board questioned costs. Mr. Dove said that there are two essential charges that the County would receive for the management of funds. One is for the money management, which right now is the Stephens group, and the second is for administrative costs from the foundation. He reviewed the possible fees to be used in negotiation with the Board, noting that the percentage that determines the fees goes down as the spendable income goes up. He reminded the Board that when turning over funds to a foundation, some control is lost over some of the types of investments made and there is risk.

Ms. Davis stated that the Stephens group is willing to advise and explain it all to the Board.

Mr. Killian advised that the only restrictions are what the Board creates. He noted that the foundation fees will be higher if fund management performs well. He said that there needs to be a good mix of protecting and investing.

The Board agreed that they would like to know that they are receiving the lowest fees they can get and that they want to invest to conserve the principal. They asked for some hypothetical numbers to see what the foundation will make in administrative fees, and what the Stephens group will make in management fees. The matter will be reviewed for further negotiation instructions.

He said that when it gets to the fully funded amount at \$18 million dollars, the compensation is in line with what he typically sees. He said the Board needs to submit the proposal and see what comes back.

A suggestion was made as possibly providing office space, which will soon be needed by the foundation. Mr. Kort advised that he thought that offer would be independent of this agreement. He said the County could offer free office space for the first three years which could be beneficial to the foundation.

Mr. Killian advised that he expects them to come back with what it will take to operate.

The Board agreed for Mr. Dove to negotiate with Haywood Health Foundation to submit to them this proposal, and if needed, to offer the foundation office space.

Medicare and Medicaid are self-reporting, and has not been reported. Once that is settled, it can be released. This is a way to release some prior to settling.

The Board discussed the possible usage of the funds and Mr. Killian advised that it is supposed to be dedicated to health care and will review this.

Chairman Kirkpatrick noted that the main reason it is taking some time to release is due to liabilities that may be present, and funds must be retained for Medicare cost reimbursements if needed. He stated that once the \$ 3million dollars is released, there is another \$6.6 million ready to be released.

Attorney Richard Kort joined the meeting by phone. He explained that in connection with addressing the comments on the draft agreement from HHF which were mostly procedural, there are revisions related to restrictions. The non-duplication of services agreement is limited to a five year term, beginning August 1, 2014 and ending on August 1, 2019. The terms of the agreement do not speak beyond its term. He noted that it does appear reasonable providing for continued restriction beyond a 72 month period. Part of the Asset Purchase Agreement has a provision that says funds may only be used for health related purposes. He noted that Attorney Tom Stukes, representing Haywood Heath Authority, indicated that Haywood County requested the health related restriction be included. That restriction would extend to Haywood Health Foundation in the second set of modifications. In addition during his conversation with Mr. Stukes, they discussed the section of the tax code that would impose intermediate sanctions on Haywood Health Foundation if they were to engage in any transaction that may have some economic benefit for private individuals; in particular, the entity operating Haywood Regional Medical Center today. The safeguard that keeps those transactions from happening are the intermediation sanction rules rather than Haywood Health Foundation losing its exempt status. The agreement now includes reference to those sanctions for events of default.

Chairman Kirkpatrick confirmed that this means that the neither the County nor HHA can provide financing to Duke LifePoint (DLP). The County cannot duplicate services that DLP provides.

Mr. Killian agreed, noting the exception would be various County entities listed in Exhibit B of the agreement which are mainly indigent and substance abuse services.

Mr. Kort stated he did not believe Mr. Stukes has the consent of DLP. Nor have they or HHF been provided a copy of the non-duplication part of agreement. He expects funds to be transferred in early 2018. He stated that he feels it is important to provide the HHF only Section 9.16 of the purchase agreement, as some documents are not in the public domain.

Mr. Killian advised that they wanted the Board to be aware of the progression of the agreement and will continue to work on amendments and provisions.
