
Team Waynesville Candidate Profiles.

Born in Stone Mountain, Georgia and raised in a blue-collar, middle-class family, I had the best of both worlds growing up in this suburb of Atlanta. Although we had quick access to big city activities, I enjoyed the benefits of living in a close-knit community with small town values. I am proud to say that I have been a resident of Haywood County for 32 years, 30 of those being in the Town of Waynesville.

In 1994, I graduated from Western Carolina University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Communication Disorders, and, in 1996, obtained a Masters of Science in Communication Disorders. As a fully licensed Speech-Language Pathologist, I worked at Thoms Rehabilitation Hospital where I treated patients in the areas of speech/language/cognitive/swallowing difficulties resulting from stroke, traumatic brain injury, and other medical conditions affecting communication.

My career path then took me to Haywood County Schools, where, as a Speech-Language Pathologist, I worked with students at Central and Clyde Elementary. When my son, Jack, was born in 2001, I became a full-time mother and continued freelance work as a PRN speech-language pathologist. I continue to hold an active license in that field of work. Now that my two children are older, I have transitioned into the role of full-time business owner/entrepreneur for our family-owned company.

My husband, Heath, a Registered Respiratory Therapist, worked at Haywood Regional Medical Center for 15 years. In October 2003, we opened Mountaineer Oxygen Services, Inc. in Waynesville and later opened a second location in Sylva. I currently serve as Vice President where I maintain contractual relationships with insurance payers, supervise our billing practices, assist with governmental compliance and accreditation for both offices, and work alongside our ten-member staff to deliver home medical needs of those in Haywood, Jackson, Swain, Graham, Cherokee, Clay, and Macon Counties. We treat our patients like family and continually strive to provide compassionate and personal care. Heath and I have always embraced our business as a ministry and continue to feel blessed and humbled to provide much needed services to our neighbors and community.

Our son, Jack, is a senior at Milligan University in Tennessee where he plays baseball, and our daughter, Anna Kate, is a junior at Tuscola High School.

Although being a wife and mother are always my top priorities, being involved in the community is also extremely important. I served as the treasurer for the Waynesville Middle School Booster Club; served as an Asheville Christian Academy Parent Advisor; served on the Economic Stability subcommittee of the Waynesville Homelessness Task Force; currently serve on the Advisory Board of Haywood Haven; and am the founder of NC Moms for Change. Since focusing on beautification projects within the town limits is incredibly important to me, I am also an active organizer and participant in ongoing litter and encampment clean-up efforts in Waynesville. - The strain on already maxed out infrastructure (Sewer, Roads, Police, Fire, EMS); a moratorium was imposed by the State due to sewer issues.
- Reinstate Quasi-Judicial approval process for new construction that gives citizens a voice. The was changed by this Mayor and Council during COVID.

CONFRONT ADDICTION, HOMELESSNESS, AND CRIME

- Common Sense Accountability-based programs; Harm Reduction approach has failed everywhere tried Asheville, San Francisco, Seattle, Los Angeles, etc.
- Statistics show Waynesville has a higher violent crime rate and property crime rate than NC as a whole, with chances of being a victim of a property crime are 1 in 14.
- Seek NC legislative help in reversing the decision of the current State Superior Court Judge to implement a mandatory bail policy that returns repeat criminals back into the community.

Both of these opportunities have provided me with valuable experience, knowledge and insight into a variety of matters that will serve as a strong foundation for serving on the Town Council.

Over the last two years, I received many requests to run for local office, which I initially brushed aside. As our town continued to decline, I prayed for guidance, asking "if it is your will for me to run, please send me a strong team to run with." God answered my prayers.
